To quote Prof. Humayun Kabir, "Failure to take effective steps at this stage can so aggravate the problem that it may sake the very foundation of our national life." The present study attempts to find out the role of parents in the student's undisciplined behavior and enable the investigator to find out the effects and remedial measures of the problem.

Concept:

Indiscipline implies negation of discipline or violation of accepted rules and regulations. On the other hand, the word 'behaviour' refers to the actions and mannerisms made by organisms, systems, or artificial entities in conjunction with their environment, which includes the other systems of organisms around as well as the physical environment. An undisciplined behaviour is also a deviant behaviour. Deviant behaviour describes actions or behaviours that violate cultural norms including formally enacted rules as well as informal violations of social norms. Etiology of deviant behaviour lies in the disturbed emotion. Indiscipline is a behavioural disorder that is classified as an act of delinquency also. Delinquency is a pattern of adjustment that deviates from the code of conduct society is attempting to enforce. Different acts of indiscipline are observed among all the levels of students. It comprises lying, stealing, playing truancy running away from home, disrespect for teachers, misbehaviour to invigilators on the

Design of the study: The descriptive survey method is adopted to obtain information concurring the current status of the problem.


Sample: In the present problem the investigators use random sampling method. Fifty persons, both teacher and students formed the sample for the present study.

Tool: Information were collected through a self-developed questionnaire. The questionnaire covers social, educational and economic domains.


Analysis:

When we analyse the data we find that-


- ❖ 100% of the samples believe that parents played an important role in the healthy development child's behaviour.


❖ 86% believed that trends of easy money and corruption get a respectable place among youths to get a better life.




❖ 68% believed that many students have unsuitable status passion which leads them very often to various anti social activities. But parents fail to fulfill such passion always.

- ➤ Our ideals should be emphasised. Cultural traditions should be understood and maintained. Materialism should not dominate our actions.
- > Counselling centers should be established to guide both the indiscipline student and their parents.
